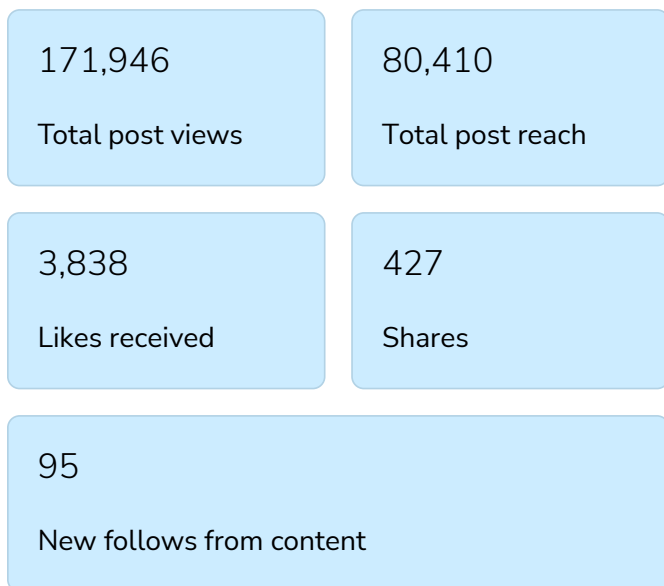

Digital Impact

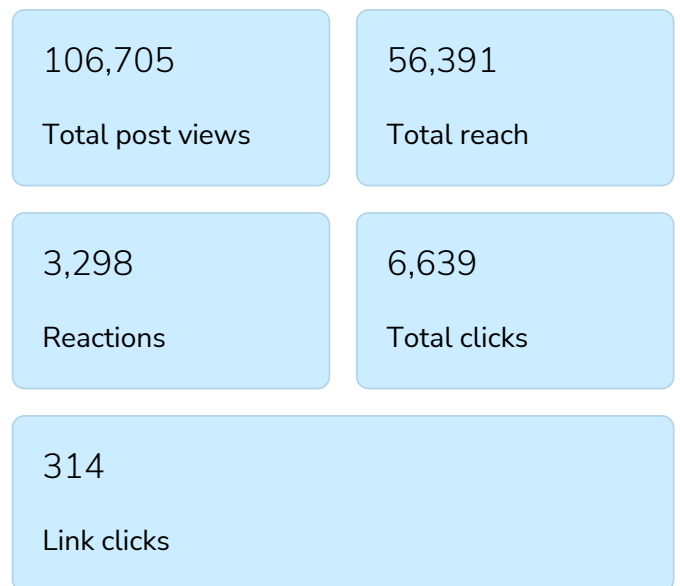
The 2026 season significantly expanded FFHL's digital visibility. 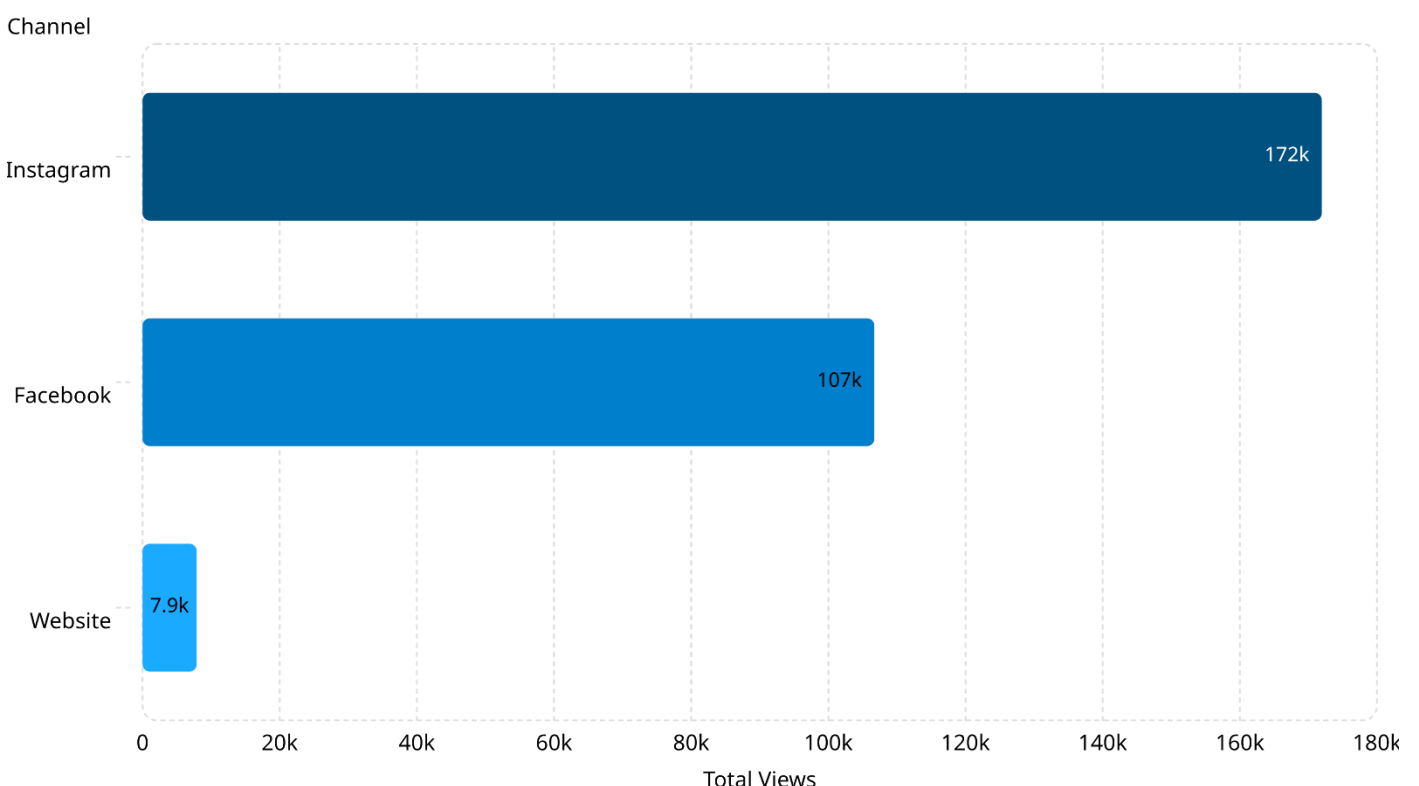

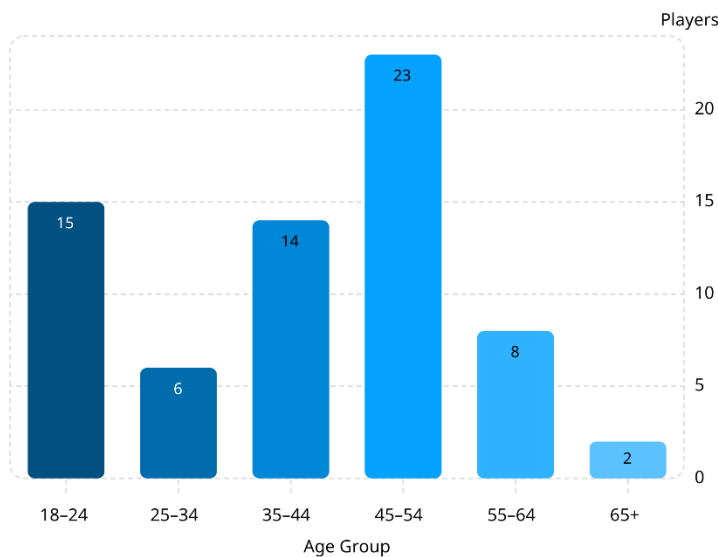

WHO WE REACH

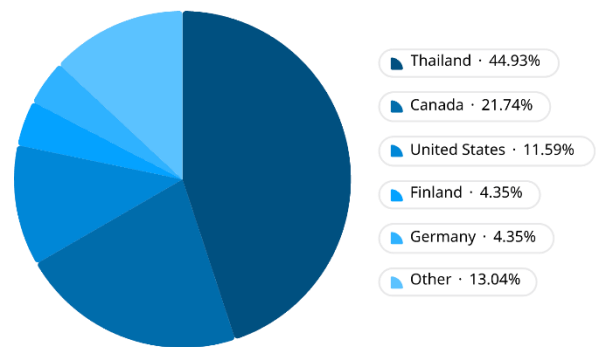
A Valuable, International, Bangkok-Centered Audience

FFHL's player community spans 11+ nationalities and a wide age range - from teenage players to seasoned veterans in their sixties. The league attracts a predominantly male audience, with an active and growing women's contingent. Thai players represent the largest single nationality at 44.9%, followed by Canadians at 21.7% - reflecting FFHL's unique positioning at the intersection of local Thai hockey development and the international expat sports community.

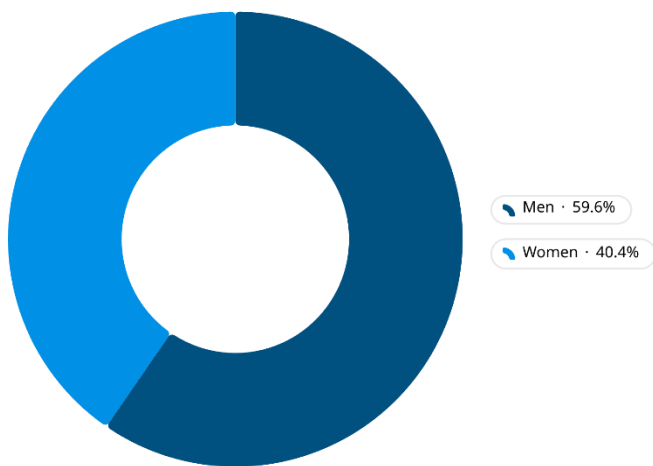

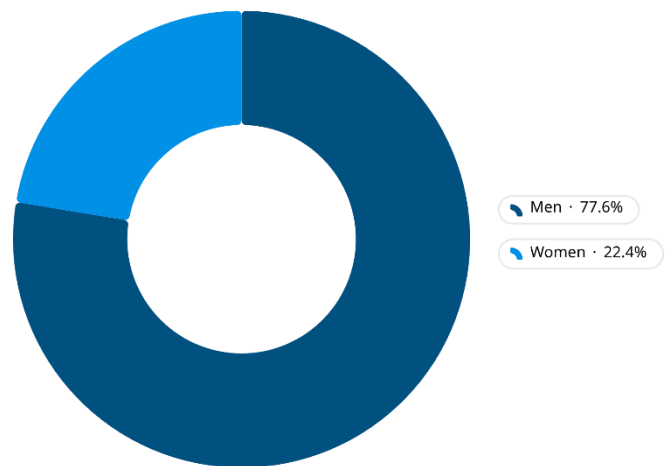
Social Audience Profile

FFHL's social audience is predominantly Bangkok-based, internationally diverse, and significantly engaged with hockey content. The Instagram audience is notably balanced with 40.4% women - far above typical sports league norms - reflecting the league's growing female player base and inclusive community storytelling. Both channels confirm strong Thailand penetration with meaningful international reach into North America, Europe, and Asia Pacific.

The Spirit of the Cup

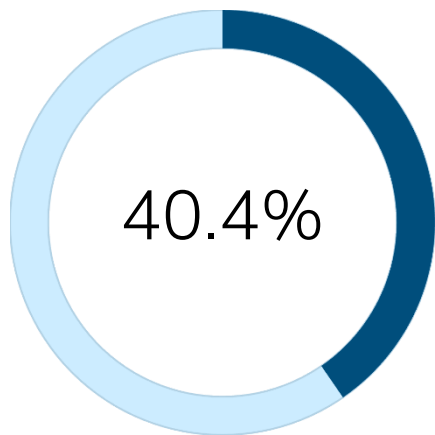

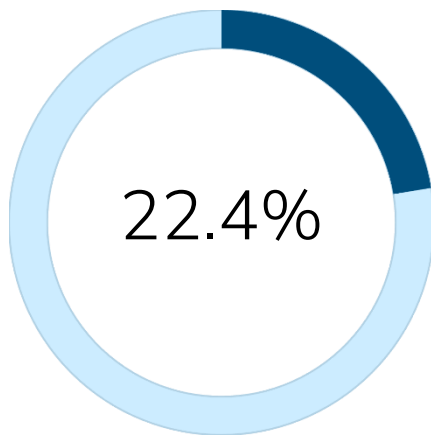
Growing Women's Participation

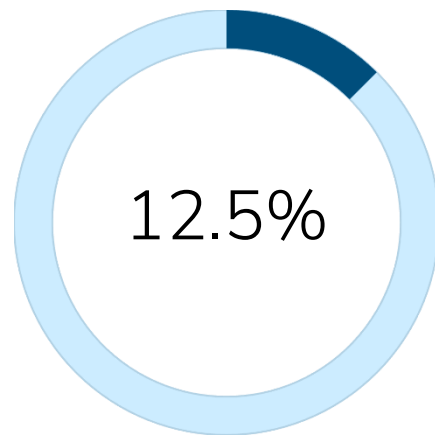

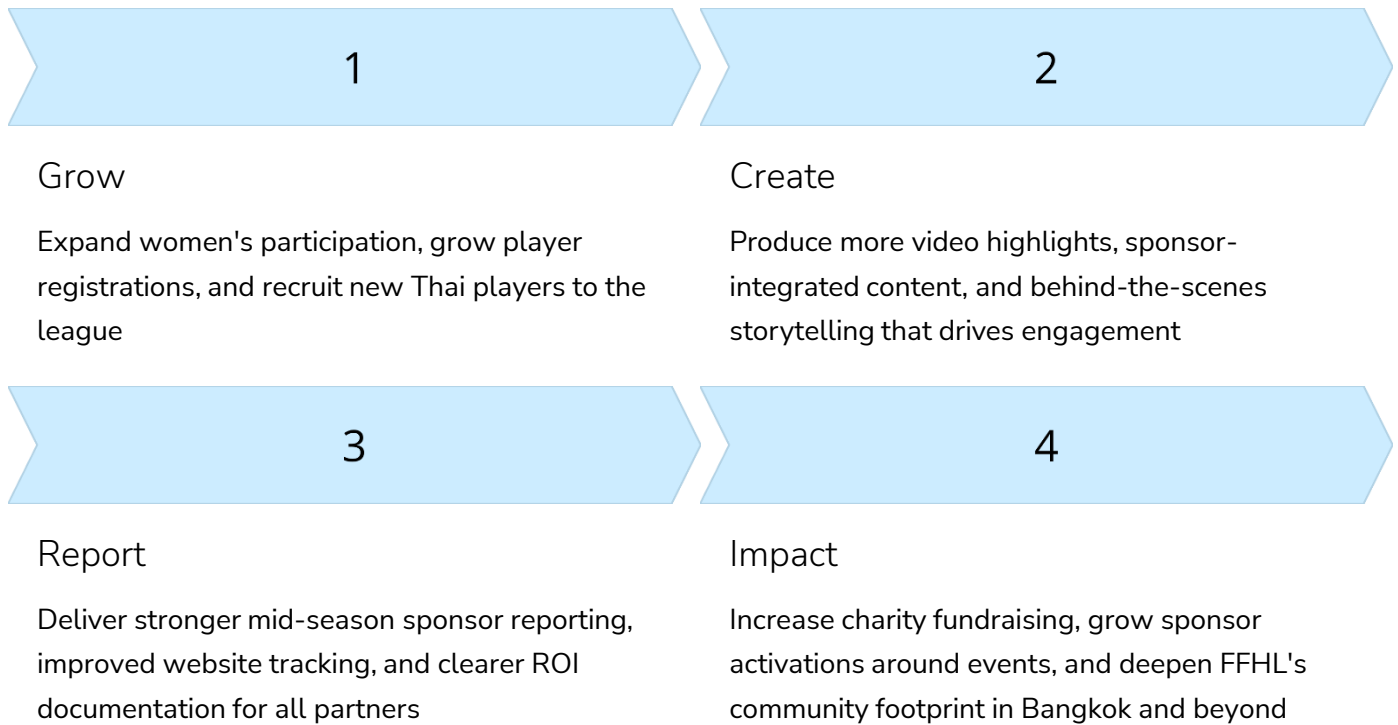
